Notable cases

R –v- Hussain (November/December 2009) Conspiracy to supply cocaine.

R –v- Atehortua (Jan – March 2009) Central Criminal Court. Murder.

R –v- Brown (September/November 2008) Juvenile gang rape. One of earliest cases involving “anonymous” witnesses.

R –v- Dass (2008) Rape involving elderly female complainant

R –v- Logan (2008) Conspiracy to cause a public nuisance. Protest against widening of MI in Yorkshire by environmental group. Proceedings stayed for abuse of process following successful submissions.

R –v- Matthews (June/September 2007) Two retrials following quashing of murder conviction.

R –v- Williams (2007) Appeal against conviction and tariff on behalf of battered woman who killed violent partner.

R –v- Matthews (2007) Successful appeal against murder conviction for murder on grounds that previous counsel had erroneously waived privilege.. This case established the important principle that waiver of privilege at the police station does not waive privilege more widely (see article written in Archbold News, April 2008 “Waiver of Privelege and Section 34 PACE).

R –v- Smith (2007) Gross negligence manslaughter involving death of inmate who committed suicide whilst on suicide watch in private prison. Defendants were prison officers.. Acquitted at end of prosecution after defence submissions.

R –v- Lambert (2006) Murder. 3 week trial.

R –v- Brogan (2006) Conspiracy to steal. 6 week trial. Leading Junior.

R –v- Smith (2005) Successful appeal involving firearms offences on behalf of firearms club owner.

R –v- Cole (2005) Appeal against conviction on behalf of battered woman who killed violent partner.

R –v- Nicholaides (2002 – 3) Conspiracy to defraud shareholders of internet services provider. Trial, appeal and confiscation proceedings.
