Notable Cases

Tim is consistently instructed in serious criminal cases. He has appeared in many important cases both at first instance and appellate levels. Those cases include:

House of Lords

R. v Hasan (2005) – a leading authority on duress and confessions.

R. v Al’Fawwaz and others (2001) – the case was concerned with the attempted extradition to the United States of persons accused of involvement in the bombings of the American embassies in Dar es Salaam and Nairobi.

Court of Appeal



K (2008) – reported at [2008] 2 Cr. App. R. 7, C.A.. Leading case on the interpretation of section 58 of the Terrorism Act 2000.



M (2005) – M. was convicted in 2002 of the murders of three generations of the same family (grandmother, mother and two daughters aged 8 and 10) in South Wales. Tim was instructed in the case in 2004 after M had been convicted. The convictions were quashed by the Court of Appeal in 2005.



Pinfold and Mackenny (2003) – the two appellants had been convicted in the late 1970s. of infamous contract murders. Their convictions were quashed after spending 30 years in prison. The case is now the leading authority on the admissibility of medical evidence going to the credibility of a witness.



Crown Court



R v Khan and others (2008) – defendants accused of a plot to kidnap and behead a British muslim soldier. Acted as leading junior for Amjad Mahmood, the only defendant to be acquitted.

R v Khalid Khaliq (2008) – acted as leading junior for man accused of section 58 of the Terrorism Act 2000.

R v Ahmed Ali and others (2008) – defendants accused of conspiring to blow up planes as they crossed the Atlantic.

R v Rangzieb Ahmed and others (2008) – the first trial in this jurisdiction of a defendant charged with directing the activities of a terrorist organisation. The defendant was also charged with membership of Al-Qaeda.

R v Ibrahim and others (2007) – trial of the 21/7 bombers. Acyed for Adel Yahay upon whom the jury were unable to decide.

R. v Ellis and others (2004) – the shooting of two young women, Letitia Shakespeare and Charlene Ellis, in Birmingham during the New Year 2003 celebrations.

R. v Maguire and others (2003) – the case concerned a bombing campaign by the Real IRA which included the detonating of explosive devices at BBC Television Centre, Ealing Broadway and Birmingham.

R. v. Appiah and others (2001) – the defendants were tried for very serious drugs and firearms offences

R. v. Hyland and others (1999) - the case concerned an alleged bombing campaign in London by members of the Real IRA.

R. v. Kebilene and others (1997) – the first prosecution of persons accused of being members of the Algerian group, the GIA.

R. v Miah and others (1995) – the trial of persons alleged to have been responsible for the murder of a young boy in Kings Cross following tensions between the white and Asian communities in Somers Town and Drummond Street.
